## LEADERSHIP COORDINATOR



Previously in the Pilot LOG, I introduced the first 6 of 10 truths that James M. Kouzes and Barry Z. Posner laid out in their book, *The Truth about Leadership . . . the NO-FADS, Heart-of-the-Matter Facts You Need to Know*. They were . . . You Make

a Difference, Credibility is the Foundation of Leadership, Values Driven Commitment, Focusing on the Future Sets Leaders Apart, You Can't Do It Alone, and Trust Rules.

I trust that you have put into practice some of the information I shared with you earlier and that they have been helpful. This time, we are going to explore the next 3 of Kouzes and Posner's fundamental leadership truths.

The seventh truth is that Challenge Is the Crucible for Greatness. The kinds of leaders most of us want to follow are most often associated with changing the status quo. No great leader got anything extraordinary done by keeping things the same. Change will invariably involve challenges . . . and challenge usually tests us. Pilots are facing many challenges as we move our organization forward. You must embrace these challenges, control what you can, and take charge of the change in order to be successful. Embracing the changes will bring you face-to-face with your level of commitment, your "grittiness," and your values. You may make some mistakes along the way, but it is critical that you learn from these mistakes . . . it is the best teacher you have.

Truth number eight reminds us . . . You Either Lead by Example or You Don't Lead at All! Leaders must keep their

promises and become role models for the values and actions they espouse. For most of us seeing is believing . . . and seeing you live out the standards you've set and the values you profess will make all the difference. A big part of leading by example is keeping your promises. Your word is only as good as your actions. Pilots look to your actions in order to determine how serious you are about what you say . . . and what it will mean to them. Your statements and actions are visible reminders of what is or is not important to you. So, when you make a mistake . . . admit it. Admitting to mistakes and shortcomings goes a long way toward building people's confidence in your integrity. It gives them another important reason to trust you . . . and remember, Trust Rules.

The Best Leaders are the Best Learners is truth number nine. You can develop yourself as a leader . . . but it takes a continual personal investment. You have to believe that you can learn to lead . . . and that you can become a better leader tomorrow than you are today. It takes time . . . it takes practice . . . and it requires setting improvement goals for yourself. By believing in yourself, taking the time to practice, being open to feedback, and prepared to take advantage of the opportunities that are open to you, you can develop into the kind of leader that will make a difference for you . . . and Pilot International.

## PROJECTS COORDINATOR



A sunny spring greeting to all Pilots and especially to project: chairs, co-chairs and committee members. As I begin today with a large mug of freshly brewed tea composing this article, it is pouring down a very chilly, wind blown rain.

For your support, the past two articles I focused on the benefits for Pilot Clubs partnering in many different ways with other organizations or Pilot Clubs. Now I want to turn your attention to evaluating this past year's projects and then focusing on next year's project choices.

As we conclude our club year we must evaluate the efforts our clubs have put forth in the areas of fund raising and also project choices. This evaluation allows us to make the necessary decisions on keeping, changing and leaving out projects for the coming year. Your evaluation of each project should include but not be restricted to the following:

1. How well were Pilot International's Mission and Vision Statements reflected?
2. How much publicity was generated for your club and/or Pilot International?
3. Could or did the project benefit from partnering?
4. Is your club the only participant with its time, talent or funds for this project?
5. Did the project generate enthusiasm from your club members and from the public or did you have to "pull teeth" for involvement and also spend lots of time explaining the project's merits to the public?
6. Was local media (television news coverage, newspaper reporters) present?
7. How many people in the community benefitted directly from your project?
8. Was club participation significant enough to "really contribute" to the project?

In summary did the project choice allow your Pilot Club to make a significant contribution that could generate enthusiasm, interest and satisfaction? Be honest in your evaluation and discuss any modifications or changes for next year's projects!

When thinking about next year's project plans,

your club should follow the familiar guideline we all know: "Something Old, Something New, Something Borrowed, Something Blue". Something old refers to a project you have invested efforts in the past but for some reason dropped. It may be time to revisit that project again with changes that have occurred since the project was dropped. An example could be re-starting the funding of window fans for the elderly poor confined to their apartments. Its importance may increase now with the decline in other state and local United Way funding for this project. Something new refers to a project that requires stepping out of the box and taking on a new endeavor. An example, could be funding, donating time and/or collecting supplies for an elderly day care center for adult Alzheimer people. We "Baby Boomers" are increasing the need for such services in our communities that provide needed daytime respite for the care givers. Something borrowed refers to looking at what other organizations or Pilot Clubs are doing for projects. We don't always have to keep re-inventing the wheel! An example could be a joint collaboration of Pilot Clubs to support a local community or state wide walk in support of "Alzheimer research". Something blue refers to a tried and "true blue" project that always has been and will continue to be a success. This is an event that has become well known, always anticipated and is well supported in your community. Examples could be support for hospital rehab departments or summer camp scholarships for mentally challenged youth.

Now my second mug of tea is almost empty and cold. Since it has now stopped raining, it is time to take our two golden retrievers out for their noon walk (I need the exercise too!). Have a great spring! In your project planning for the coming year, keep INCREASING CLUB MEMBERSHIP as one of each project's most important intended goals. Always remember that STRESSED spelled backwards is DESSERTS. So take the opportunity to turn all your stressed moments into delightfully, enjoyable desserts!

Her research as a graduate student focused on developing a new technique in Nuclear Magnetic Resonance (NMR) to help determine structural information in large

proteins that have been glycosylated, an enzymatic process that attaches glycans to proteins, lipids, or other organic molecules. This enzymatic process produces one of the fundamental biopolymers found in cells (along with DNA, RNA, and proteins). This is important information for pharmaceutical companies designing and developing therapeutic drugs.
