## How Is Your Club's Attractor Factor?

■ Here is a handy **Five Step Program** to help you find out!



**A**re you considering starting a new Pilot Club in your hometown because you have so many members? Or, are you wondering where you will find your next member?

Here is a **Five Step program** to help you find and build your Pilot Club's Attractor Factor.

### STEP 1:

#### Does your Club want new members?

This may sound like a silly question, however, if your members are not inviting new members there may be some hidden reasons why they are not. At your next meeting ask your members if they sincerely want new members. If others perceive that there is not a place for them in your club it may be that is what your members are unconsciously projecting... and not attracting.

### STEP 2:

#### What does it take to attract new members?

There are four basic Attractors:

1. Club is known for fun, worthwhile meetings
2. Club offers opportunities for leadership and new skills

3. Members are outstanding individuals open to inviting and accepting new members
4. Club membership consists of like-minded individuals involved in improving the quality of life in their community

### STEP 3:

#### How are your club's four Attractor Factors?

Do an inventory. If your club could use a tune-up there are resources for you.

### STEP 4:

#### Learn from your best resources.

1. Read some of that stuff in your club manual. The sections on Membership and Meeting tips are very helpful and it is amazing what you will find in the PI Section.
2. As many members as possible should attend your District Spring Convention and Fall Council. Your members will learn from the success of others in your District.
3. Think of it as a club adventure... as many members as possible should attend Pilot International convention, they will learn from others' experience and your club will gain new resources and perspectives. It is a proven fact, your members will come back energized and on fire!

### FINAL STEP:

#### Set a goal.

How many new members do you want to attract next month? Next year? Imagine those new members already in your club. Start planning what projects they will be accomplishing. See the difference in your community. Feel the difference in your Pilot club. It will happen.

**A** It's time to turn our attention to plans for the **2008-2009 Fundraising Year**. For fundraising success in 2008-09, review 2007-08 Plans of Work first. In my last column, I listed six steps to a successful fundraising plan. The last step was to establish a method of evaluation. This is a good time to start evaluating your fundraising efforts for 2007-08.

Before engaging into your Plans of Work and setting your goals for 2008-09, hold a **strategic planning session** with your fundraising division and talk about the results from 2007-08. Here are a few questions to help you focus your discussion and/or reflections:

1. What did we achieve in 2007-08?
2. What were the results from fundraising events—financial, non-financial benefits, and public awareness?
3. What worked?
4. What didn't?
5. What would we do again in 2008-09?
6. What did we learn from 2007-08?
7. How many new donors did we attract?
8. What would we change, add or delete from next year's Plan of Work?
9. What strengths did we capitalize on?

10. What weaknesses could we improve upon?
11. What were our proudest moments in 2007-08?
12. What were our lowest moments in 2007-08?

Most importantly, when you have some perspective about last year you can start the 2008-09 Pilot year with a solid foundation. You can avoid what didn't work before, tweak good ideas that could be great and strengthen your core fundraising events. Keep in mind that it's the "long game" that counts. Short term goals are important, but it's a long term mindset, strategy and plan that will help you succeed in the long run.

Again, please don't forget that I am asking all clubs throughout Pilot International to send details of fundraisers so I can share them with everyone. I'll list them in the *Log* and develop a resource guide to aid clubs in planning for the future, and we plan to use the "best of the best" ideas in a workshop at convention. - Club name and district
- Contact information—name, e-mail, phone numbers, etc.
- Name and description of fundraiser—include the who, what, when, where and how.
- Goals and target groups to benefit from the fundraiser.

- Total expense—itemize, if possible.
- Net profit.

## First Year Success Story

**T**he **E. C. Brice Elementary Anchor Club**, sponsored by the Mt. Pleasant Pilot Club, Texas, achieved their dream with a service project for their first year as an Anchor Club. When the club chartered last October, their goal has been to provide a place for “Christina” to play like all of the other children. Christina moved to Mt. Pleasant this past summer after having been in a horrific car accident in her hometown of Orlando, Florida. E. C. Brice has never had a student with physical disabilities and there was no specialized playground equipment. The children wanted not only to provide equipment for Christina to use, but also to leave something permanent so other children with physical challenges could use it in the future.



After looking at many options, the children chose a swing estimated to cost around \$1,200. After some searching, they found the swing (originally priced at \$400) for \$135. The swing frame priced at over \$700, was instead built by the maintenance department of the Mt. Pleasant Independent School District with steel donated by McKelvey Industries of Mt. Pleasant. So the total cost of the completed project ended up being only

\$135. Upon completion, the children, their advisor, Cristy Nolen, and Pilot sponsors Betty Reese and Candye Dorsey presented the swing to E. C. Elementary School with a ribbon-cutting. They invited Christina to come back out and swing at recess time.

In their inaugural year these fourth grade Anchors have presented BrainMinders to the children in the after-school program, collected food for a Thanksgiving dinner for a

family, cleaned the flower beds and planted bulbs and plants in the school garden, held a “Guess The Number of M&Ms” contest for Valentine’s, and now have donated the swing. All the children will be going to P.E. Wallace Middle School next year, where they plan to charter another Anchor Club. The current Anchor Club at E. C. Brice will continue with incoming fourth graders.

**R**ecently the **Alpine High School Anchor Club** and the Pilot Club of Alpine provided assistance to the Casa Hogar Orphanage in Ojinaga, Mexico, which cares for 32 children with a staff of eight caregivers, each earning little more than \$200 a month. The children are mostly under the age of 10, many with special needs. Last year, Big Bend area Presbyterian churches raised over \$3,000 for the children. The Alpine Anchor and Pilot Clubs provided school supplies, birthday party funds, books, Christmas presents and toiletries; they also collected coats and sweaters for the children.

The Pilot Club of Dublin, sponsors of the **Anchor Clubs of Dublin, East Laurens and West Laurens High Schools**, hosted an Anchor Leadership Workshop for Anchors in the Central Region of Georgia District in November. More than 30 Anchors and advisors from six Anchor Clubs participated in workshops offered on officer training, basic auto care, scrapbooking, time management and organizational skills, scholarships, and Q&A for advisors and teachers. Carole Gra-

ham, guest speaker from Eastman, Georgia, offered an entertaining and informational view on current teen etiquette. Dublin Pilots provided lunch for the group while the Anchor members shared ideas and activities. The **Anchor Club of Hempfield** raised over \$650 participating in the annual Jingle Bell Run for Arthritis. The group is usually one of the largest participating. The club also raised \$312 at a fundraiser for the Four Diamonds Fund. The mission of the Four Diamonds Fund is to conquer childhood cancer by assisting children treated at Penn State Children’s Hospital. The Fund offsets the cost of treatment that insurance does not

cover, as well as expenses that may disrupt the welfare of the child, such as car repairs, rent, or household utilities.

The **Sayville High School Anchor Club** collected and donated Christmas gifts for twenty children living in a local homeless shelter. They also collected juice boxes and snacks for the children earlier in the year. They held a bake sale where all proceeds (\$113) were donated to the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation in honor of a teacher in their school district who passed away earlier this year. And on a rainy December Sunday, fifteen Anchors volunteered their time for the Salvation Army Kettle Effort.
