Message from the Chair

2006-2007

PIF Annual Report



This past year as Pilot International Foundation Chair was truly filled with Friendship, Service, Fun & Laughter for me. I would like to thank the members of the Board of Trustees and all of you who joined in so enthusiastically to make it a successful year for the Foundation.

One of this report's primary functions is to acknowledge those who contributed, whether in money, or in time and energy, to the Foundation in 2006-07, and to extend our deepest appreciation to you. You made it possible for the Foundation to fill its traditional roles—fundraising, grants and scholarships, BrainMinders—as well as go above and beyond in building our new Heritage Center.

This year the Foundation awarded scholarships to 66 deserving students and matching grants to 47 clubs, many of them for equipment for Project Lifesaver, a program that continued to grow in popularity. By the end of this past year, a cumulative total (since inception) of approximately 9,000 BrainMinders presentations to 351,000 children were reported. Since the program's introduction in 2001 over 500,000 books have been distributed to clubs in three countries. The Japan District provides their own version to Japanese school children. We also refined the program for teens and introduced brand-new programs for seniors and baby-boomers. Perhaps raising the funds necessary to build the Heritage Center temporarily diverted our attention from our usual fundraising efforts—we did not quite meet the Goal for Grants & Scholarships this year—but with a total of \$158,317 we came close. I urge all clubs to renew their efforts—if we do not meet our goal again, it means that some very worthy projects may go unfunded next year.

And speaking of the Heritage Center, it has been a thrill to follow its progress, illustrated with pictures on our website, from the laying of the foundation last fall, to the bare-bones frame we saw at the Cornerstone Ceremony in February, to the final structures completed this November. I hope to see you at the Dedication in Macon on February 9—it will be a grand celebration!

As you review the report on the pages that follow, you can feel proud that your Foundation has accomplished so much tangible good. You can also take this opportunity to look forward to a future where the Endowment will provide for even bigger and better accomplishments, and where the PI Headquarters and Heritage Center will stand as a symbol of the Pilot legacy for generations to come.
