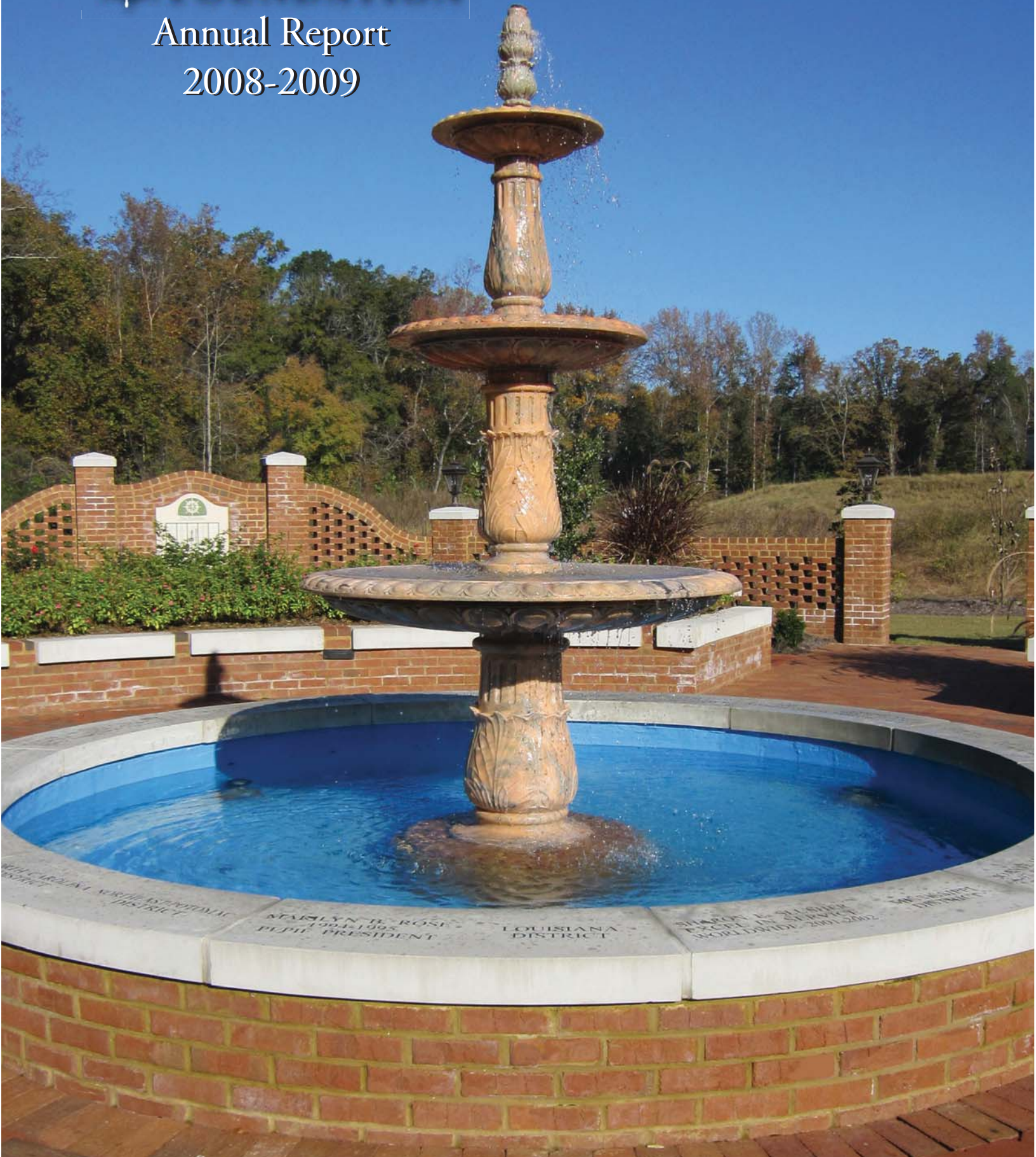

The Gyp Hills Pilot Club of Medicine Lodge Brings Home the Reality of Shaken Baby Syndrome and Birth Defects Caused by Alcohol Abuse.

Pilot International Foundation awarded a grant to the Gyp Hills Pilot Club based on the following goals and objectives: • Pilot members to work with the Barber Health Department to educate and train clients and parents in Barber County. • To prevent brain injuries or brain related disorders and disabilities. • To cause significant improvement in the quality of life for the youth in Barber County. • To provide a public awareness of child abuse and how it can be presented. • To reach baby sitters, teen-agers and mothers and fathers through informative training sessions.

Modern technology played an important role in accomplishing these goals for the club's program called, "Keeping Baby Safe from Harm." The Pilot Club purchased a program which included a "Shaken Baby Syndrome Simulator" (SBS), a Fetal Alcohol Syndrome Manikin (FAS), and a "Drug Affected Simulator." The program from Reality Works illustrates the devastating effects of drugs, alcohol or abuse on an infant. It effectively ensures the participants in the program will never face that reality.

The Shaken Baby Syndrome Simulator's transparent head clearly defines the traumatic brain injuries caused in this form of child abuse. The life-sized simulator cries and when shaken, affected sections of the brain light up to illustrate where brain damage has occurred. The program supplies material to help create a plan to manage the stress of dealing with an inconsolable child without causing harm.

The Fetal Alcohol Syndrome Manikin is based on actual FAS infants. The manikin is small for its gestational age and features some of alcohol's many devastating effects: small head circumference, narrow eye openings, flat mid-face, thin upper lip, skin folds covering the inner corners of the eyes and more. The FAS materials outline the injuries not physically apparent such as brain damage, behavior problems and learning disabilities.

The Drug-Affected Simulator is a startling, true-to-life representation of what substance abuse can do to an unborn child. Small for its gestational age this electronic demonstrator exhibits a painful expression, tiny limbs, tremors and heart-breaking cries of a drug-affected infant.

Each of the demonstrators comes with a PowerPoint presentation and supporting collateral materials, batteries, a one-year warranty, diapers and receiving blankets. The first presentation was made by the Barber Health Department to the Pilot Club members.

The Pilot Club of Gyp Hills has successfully created media publicity, public awareness and praise from the health department for providing this important program. The club manned a booth at their local Health Fair and received some of these comments and observations from their audiences. "Didn't know that alcohol could cause such physical deformities." "How soon can these presentations be made in the public school system?" Older people were in awe of how the manikins operated in activation. Viewers who had not been around these types of abuses were horrified at the damage related in the SBS manikin.
