This year three impartial judges from the private sector carefully reviewed and graded the entries submitted for Anchor Advisor of the Year. The point system ranged from 0 to 4 for the highest merit. The nominations were judged on how clearly the service activities were defined, service impact, content of nomination letters, photos submitted, creativity, originality, and why the club felt their advisor stood out above all others. Each entry truly reflected the support and enthusiasm club members have for their advisor. And the winners are:



Beth Kennedy

Walker High School Anchor Club, sponsored by the Pilot Club of Jasper, Alabama

This year's Anchor Advisor of the Year was a former Anchor herself, and has served for seven years as advisor to the Anchor Club of Walker High School. She uses all that experience to identify the club's and community's needs, plan projects to meet those needs, set goals and guide her Anchors to the successful completion of those goals. For example, last year she helped initiate a new pet therapy program in the community. On designated Saturday mornings, the Anchors met at the Walker County Humane Society to pick up puppies to visit several local nursing homes. Ms. Kennedy always went along, giving up her Saturdays for the club. The program was a big hit with residents, Anchors and puppies, and is continuing this year.



Another big ongoing project for the Walker Anchors is the annual Aquanaut Ball, an event to honor Jasper's Special Olympics swim team. Such a big party is always a logistical challenge, but Ms. Kennedy is more than up to the task. As a wife, mother of two, and honors science teacher, her organizational skills are legendary, as she routinely juggles the obligations of work, family, and other activities, with the many hours she devotes to her Anchor responsibilities.

Danny Gambell, principal at Walker High, credits Ms. Kennedy with leading the club to be named District Anchor Club of the Year several times in recent years. He says she motivates and challenges her students to reach their



full potential. The 63 Anchor members, as well as her other students, look up to her and consider her their role model. Ms. Kennedy's devotion, hard work, and generosity represent the traits of leadership and good citizenship that Anchor was created to instill in all its members. Her genuine love of her Anchors and community make her truly our Outstanding Anchor Advisor of the Year.

TWith our year at the halfway point, it is time to reflect on the surgical changes you have implemented in your club (see my Club Operations column in the Winter 2007 *Pilot Log*, page 44). In other words, it is time to have a bi-yearly check-up to see how you are progressing.

Are you having more success in your projects, your fundraising efforts, your member participation? Are your members more knowledgeable about Pilot? Have you increased your membership? Are you retaining and training your members? If you don't answer yes to all of the above, maybe you need to re-evaluate and perform a little more surgery on your club, taking a totally different approach.

A new approach may be to just ask each member to come up with a solution to your club's specific problem. Make it fun for your members... have a contest with those offering winning ideas being treated to ice cream and cake at the next meeting, give them a prize for the most effective, most creative ideas, etc. Just determine where the need is and "go for it."

One area that sometimes proves to be a dilemma for some clubs is the recruiting of new members.

Members and the retention of members are vital to our organization. We all enjoy the fun of being a Pilot and want to share it with others. Devising new ways to share our love of Pilot is an avenue that involves the participation of all members.

A few suggestions:

- ⊙ Assign two or three of your members a certain meeting night to bring a prospective member and rotate this until all your club members have brought a possible new recruit.
- ⊙ Make the prospective member the highlight of your meeting, (not a special Share Pilot meeting, but a short portion dedicated to your "special guests").
- ⊙ Make sure that every member present speaks to the guests.
- ⊙ Have a special ten-minute segment on "Why I Love Pilot," "How Being A Pilot Has Made A Difference In my Life," or "What Pilot Offers" topics presented by members of the club.
- ⊙ Provide name tags for each member so the potential member will not have to fumble for a name.
- ⊙ Have a detailed handout on the "Facts" of your club to distribute to prospects so they will know what is expected of them (time, participation, etc.) and what they can expect from the club in return.

Always remember that the "Club Members" are your most valuable asset. Their ideas, participation and dedication are reflected in the success of your club.
