Message from the Chair

This past year was filled with significant moments of which all Pilots, as members of Pilot International Foundation, can be proud. Among them, the one I was personally most honored to be a part of was the dedication of our new Heritage Center on February 9, 2008. Presiding at this momentous occasion where over 400 Pilots, Co-Pilots and friends of Pilots celebrated the fulfillment of years of dreaming and planning, not to mention hard work, was a thrill I will always remember. My joy in seeing this project completed was magnified by the pride I saw in the faces of Pilots seeing their new headquarters for the first time.

When then President Elect Debbie and I traveled to headquarters in the spring to plan the convention in Phoenix, we had the pleasant task of presenting the final check to Stroud Construction and receiving in return the final waiver of lien. When all the costs were totaled, we came in \$160,000 under budget with Stroud.

Heritage Center fundraising was quite successful for the year—for the 2007-2008 year, we received \$322,164 in cash and \$1,075 in-kind, bringing the yearly total in donations received to \$323,239. With \$640,593 in revenue from the sale of properties on Rogers Avenue and College Street, and cumulative totals of \$626,239 in cash and \$28,161 in-kind donations, since we began we have raised \$1.3 million altogether, a little over half of the total cost of construction and furnishings. Our fundraising efforts will continue until we can retire the full amount.

We saw another dream begin to take shape, one with an even longer history. Seven years ago plans were first approved to build a Heritage Garden on the grounds of the Foundation offices. The Garden was envisioned as a

means to immortalize Pilots past and present who have worked so hard and given so much to make so many lives better. As it was conceived, donations to the Garden would endow our Grants and Scholarship Fund, and grow Pilot's future. This past year construction on the Garden was begun, and a dedication is planned for January 2009. We will continue to accept donations to grow our endowment fund, and bricks in honor or in memory of family and friends are still available.

We can all be proud that we surpassed our Goal for the Grants and Scholarships Fund of \$175,000 this year, with a grand total of \$179,999 in donations. This accomplishment allowed us to award 52 matching grants for a total of \$118,945, and 64 scholarships for a total of \$93,050.

It was an honor and privilege to serve as Chair of the Foundation in a year of accomplishment and change. None of these achievements would have been possible without the enthusiastic participation of each of you. Thank you on behalf of the Foundation for your generosity and support.

The Treasure Coast Pilot Club of Vero Beach, Florida opened its "Treasure Chest" for Project Lifesaver when it received a \$5,000 matching grant from PIF. It was a proud moment for the club when they presented the check for \$10,000 to the Alzheimer/Parkinson Association of Indian River County for this worthwhile cause. Members were pleased to helping people with Alzheimer's disease, traumatic brain injury, autism and other related brain disorders, protecting the wandering and bring peace of mind to families, caregivers and their community.

The grant started with a "Wish List" from the Association that included an additional Emergency Locator System to be purchased for the Sheriff's Department. The search team works in a 360° area sweep covering Indian River County, so the addition of this third locator system will enhance their ability to rescue clients wearing the electronic monitoring bracelets. The Department will also receive two additional transmitter and tester replacement kits. The Alzheimer/Parkinson Association obtained twenty transmitter and tester replacement kits with a year's supply of batteries and straps for future use along with additional miscellaneous and marketing supplies.

The Pilot Club of Bishopville, South Carolina received a matching grant of \$2,082 from the Foundation and purchased an aquatic lift for the pool at Camp Burnt Gin, a summer camp for children with brain-related disorders and disabilities, physical disabilities, and chronic illnesses. The camp is located in Sumter County and serves residents of South Carolina.

Publicity included several half-page articles in area newspapers, and earlier coverage prompted a front-page article in a Sumter newspaper, *The Item*, featuring pictures and a video link on the internet on June 25 showing the aquatic lift in operation, three interviews, and the Pilot Club of Bishopville presenting the BrainMinders Puppet Show to campers emphasizing water safety. The Pilot Club of Bishopville increased awareness of brain-related disorders, and improved the quality of life for those campers who might not otherwise be able to enjoy the pool.

The Pilot Club of Sayville, New York received a \$1,500 matching grant from Pilot International Foundation to help fund (in cooperation with another community organization) the purchase and installation of a poured rubber surface for an existing playground area at Angela's House II, a home that specializes in caring for children with severe medical and physical conditions that require life-sustaining technology. The special surface will permit the wheel chair-bound children access to the existing wheel chair swing and hammock, which is not now accessible to wheel chairs.

Volunteer members of the Pilot Club of Sayville have initiated a supertime reading program for the children. This helps to occupy and stimulate the children as they wait for their turns to be individually fed by staff members. The children will benefit from the mental stimulation, social-interaction, education and acceptance provided by our member-readers and this, in turn, will encourage improved interactive and conversational skills, and ego enhancement.

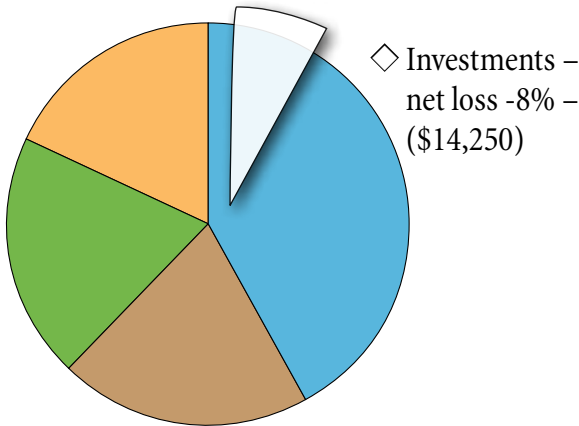

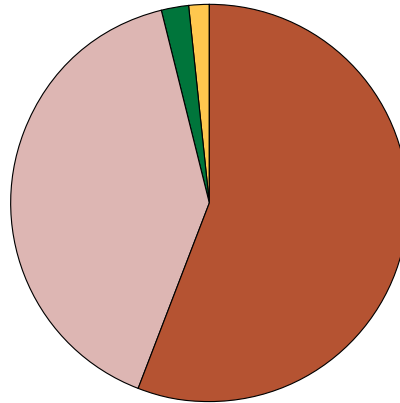
Statement of Activities for the year ended June 30, 2008

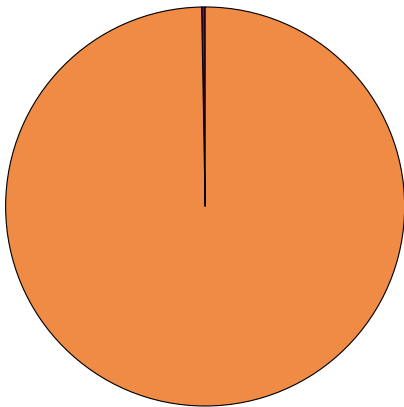

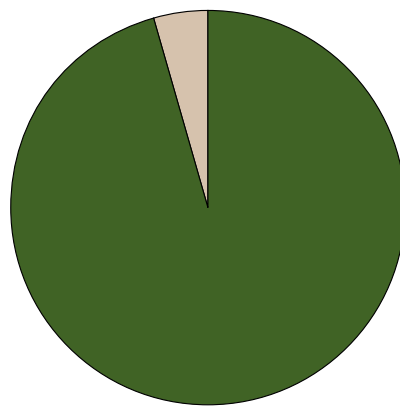
