

## Bob King Co-Pilot Memorial Scholarship Application



**The Bob King Co-Pilot Memorial Scholarship** was established in 2015 to provide financial assistance to graduating high school seniors and/or undergraduate students preparing for a career that furthers Pilot International's mission. Co-Pilot Bob "Santa Bob" King was the husband of the late Shirley King, a member of the Pilot Club of CSRA in Augusta, Georgia. Bob was passionate in his support of Co-Pilot projects on the state and international level, most notably improvements at Pilot International Headquarters in Macon, GA. Bob passed away on September 3, 2012, while on a cruise celebrating his 44th wedding anniversary. During the 2014 Pilot International Leadership Conference, the Co-Pilots elected to fund a scholarship in Bob's memory.

### Eligibility:

- Graduating high school seniors and/or undergraduate students.
- Career goal(s) that further Pilot International's mission of (1) working with youth and young adults in leadership and development, (2) helping people and encouraging brain safety and health, or (3) caring for families during times of need.
- Awards are based on community service, financial need, academic success, and application contents.

### Details:

- Scholarships are awarded for one academic year.
- A student may re-apply and be granted the Bob King Co-Pilot Memorial Scholarship for no more than three (3) additional years.
- Award amounts may vary but will not exceed \$2,000.00 per year.

### Application Deadline:

**March 16, 2026, 5:00 p.m. (EDT).** All required documents must be submitted in one (1) electronic file in PDF format to [PIFFscholarships@pilothonq.org](mailto:PIFFscholarships@pilothonq.org)

## **Bob King Co-Pilot Memorial Scholarship Application**

### Requirements:

The following documents must be submitted in one (1) electronic file in PDF format to be considered for this scholarship:

- Student Application form. This form must be typed and signed.
- Your resume or CV.
- A list of extracurricular and/or community activities, if not on your resume or CV.
- Your most recent original transcript with cumulative GPA (does not need to be officially sealed) as of January 1, 2026.
- Your 2026-27 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) Submission Summary that includes your Student Aid Index (SAI).
- Financial need essay of less than 300 words or less explaining your need for this scholarship and how this scholarship can assist you.
- Career goals essay of less than 300 words describing your career goals and how the achievement of your goals will further Pilot International's mission.
- Two (2) letters of recommendation dated within the last 12 months from teachers, professors, faculty advisors or employers.
- Proof of acceptance to a college or university for the 2026-27 Academic Year.
- (Optional) Prior high school and/or undergraduate transcripts, if applicable.

If any of the required documents are missing or incomplete, the application will be disqualified.

### Policies for all Pilot International Scholarships

1. The Executive Committee of Pilot International will provide the overall administration of the scholarship funds.
2. The Scholarship Committee will review and grade scholarship applications and make recommendations to the Executive Committee of Pilot International. The Scholarship Committee will recommend as recipients of scholarships those persons who in the sole judgment of the committee are best suited to further the purposes of the fund.
3. Scholarship funds may be used for tuition and related educational expenses considered necessary by the Executive Committee. Actual amounts awarded may vary.
4. In accordance with IRS regulations, officers, directors, trustees, employees, or current members of the Scholarship Committee of Pilot International are not eligible for scholarship programs sponsored by Pilot International.
5. When an application has been approved, the scholarship recipient will be notified and payment will be made in one installment directly to the applicant's educational institution upon receipt of the appropriate forms.
6. A student may reapply annually by submitting an updated application and supporting documentation for those scholarships that are renewable.
7. A scholarship applicant is limited to one scholarship award annually. Applicants applying for more than one scholarship must submit the correct application package for each scholarship. If an applicant is eligible for more than one scholarship, the Scholarship Committee will decide on the scholarship most appropriate for the individual. individual.
